CYBER BULLYING



The Internet and social media platforms have evolved how we communicate and these have added conveniences to our lifestyles. However, this can also expose us to new challenges and threats.

Cyberbullying is one phenomenon which can have devastating effects on our young and can potentially be harmful, leaving lifelong scars.

Recognising this emerging threat, the Guidance and Counselling unit of Sunway College JB stepped up efforts to spread awareness by organising workshops on cyberbullying prevention, termed Media Heroes and is based on a research project from Germany on school-based prevention of cyberbullying.

The workshop was first conducted for students, during which it was discovered that many had experienced or witnessed cyberbullying at different degrees. Another session was organised for parents with school going children between 12 – 18 years of age, to help them understand the common ways children experience cyberbullying as well as to learn various strategies on how to help curb cyberbullying behaviours and intervene should cyberbullying incidents occur.

School Counsellors also participated in the programme hoping to better equip themselves with knowledge, competencies and skillsets to detect, address and overcome cyberbullying incidents among school students.

Managed by qualified, registered and licensed counsellors, the Guidance and Counselling unit provides individual and group counselling, mentormentee and peer helping programmes as well as organise activities and campaigns to promote mental and emotional wellness among the campus community.





COLLEGE ESSENTIALS





College Essentials is a programme that aims to provide students with value added knowledge and skills through a series of resource-rich talks and experiential workshops. Upon fulfilling the required criteria, students will be eligible to receive a certificate that serves as a formal record of all extra-curricular activities.

This programme comprise core modules and other interesting modules, all classified into three levels:

- Learning Support (Level 1)
- Self Development (Level 2)
- Personal Advancement (Level 3)

This value-added service is part of the College's placement support efforts to prepare graduating students with soft skills beyond academic knowledge. Through the modules delivered, the programme aims to nurture well-rounded graduates who are future-ready

and armed with the 5Cs – Confidence, Commitment, Curiosity, Creativity and Critical Thinking.

The Presentation Survival Kit is a very popular workshop among students where they learn how to deliver a presentation professionally, including voice projection and body language. Other workshops in the series include Essential Writing for College Assignments, Recipe to Writing A Resume and How Can Graduates Stand Out from the Competition, among others.
